

LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

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1. All livestock exhibits must be in place Sunday, **July 9th** (see individual species requirements).
2. Any livestock health papers must be available for checking when livestock is unloaded. Exhibitors should check directly with the project superintendent for stall space.
3. All stalls, pens and other exhibit areas shall be kept clean. Failure by an exhibitor to comply with this rule permits the superintendent to have the areas cleaned and charge the exhibitor. Exhibitors must clean their pens and stalls at the end of the fair.
4. All feed and bedding shall be furnished by the exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
5. All manure must be removed from stalls, pens and other exhibit areas and placed in designated manure bunkers daily.
6. All cattle must be exercised in cattle show ring and washed on wash rack only.
7. Dairy and beef breeding stock should be vaccinated for I.B.R., BVD, P13 and Haemophilus.
8. No animal may be shown in fitting and showmanship classes by more than one person. Own animal must be shown.
9. No unethical fitting or procedures of animals will be allowed.
10. Animals showing signs of ringworm, warts, foot rot, pink eye, sore mouth or any other contagious or infectious disease, can NOT be exhibited.
11. No water tanks allowed on the grounds.
12. In order to be shown in showmanship, all animals must be shown in a regular class, unless otherwise stated.
13. No livestock trailers may be left on the fairgrounds or parked outside the back gate, Please take them home for the week.
14. Project animal may be subject to drug testing.
15. Market animals must be owned by the exhibitor.
16. Under the Weights and Measure Act of 1964, Public Act 283, livestock offered for sale must be weighed in on a certified scale and must be represented and sold at the certified weight. rounding up of weight is not acceptable and is, in fact illegal.
17. Livestock exhibitors must be in compliance with Animal health requirements as defined by the Department. Please refer to the MDARD web site www.michigan.gov/MDARD and Exhibitions Requirements for Livestock
18. All Live Exhibits are the responsibility of the exhibitor from the time it leaves home until it is released from the fair. The exhibitor is responsible for providing all food, water and maintenance necessary to maintain the health of the animal.
19. No ancillary fans are allowed in any of the Livestock Barns.
