GENERAL RULES

1. Livestock exhibitors must be in compliance with animal health requirements as defined by the department. Please refer to the MDARD web site www.michigan.gov/documents/mda/ExReq_225448_7.pdf at the time of check in all cattle must be identified with radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags. Animals will not be allowed with official metal ear tags or official registered breed tattoos as their identification.
2. Judging will be on Tuesday at 4:30 p.m.
3. Both registered and commercial (non-registered) heifers can be shown.
4. Showmanship age as of January 1st of the current year.
5. Limited to 5 breeding animals, 2 market beef (steers and/or market heifer), 2 feeders and 1 carcass steer or heifer per exhibitor. Limit of 2 in the same class unless noted.
6. All registered breeding heifer entered in the show must be registered with the official breed association in the name of the exhibitor prior to May 1st of the current year. All non-registered breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor or co-owned with immediate family by May 1st of the current year. Registration and transfer papers must be approved by the superintendent at check-in time. Animals that are not registered or whose registration papers are not approved will show in the commercial class.
7. Check-in ALL breeding animals on Sunday between 3pm and 5pm in the show pavilion.
8. Each exhibitor must own market cattle by February 17th and complete necessary tagging paperwork and turn it into the Extension Office by February 17th to be eligible for the show and sale.
9. All market beef must be dehorned or have under 2" length, or they will not be eligible for the show.
10. Market beef will be weighed off the truck on Sunday from 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. in show pavilion.
11. All carcass animals must be broke to lead.
12. Market beef will be eligible for show.
13. First market class to start at 900 lbs. for steers and 800 lbs. for heifers.
14. When entering feeder or market cattle, indicate the section but no class number. This will be determined after animals are weighed.
15. Each exhibitor is responsible to care for his or her market animals until release time and help load them on the truck.
16. Beef shown in a market class cannot be shown in a breeding class.
17. Grooming chutes to be set in designated area.
18. No unethical fitting or procedures of animals will be allowed.
19. There will be a manure disposal fee of \$5 per animal. Fees are due with the barn space forms on May 1st. There is an additional \$10 species fee per family, that will be go towards additional species expenses.
20. There will be a peewee showmanship class. Youth showing in this class must be accompanied into the show ring by a parent or legal guardian.
21. Club aisle duty is the responsibility of individual clubs to assign youth in that club.
