GENERAL RULES

1. All sheep must have an official ID for scrapie.
2. Livestock exhibitors must be in compliance with animal health requirements as defined by the department. Please refer to the MDARD web site www.michigan.gov/documents/mda/ExReq_225448_7.pdf
3. Check-in all breeding sheep with superintendent on Monday until noon. Limit of 5 breeding animals, any number in a class.
4. Judging at 9:00 am. Wednesday. Showmanship followed by breeding stock, wool judging, individual market lamb, pen and feeder lambs. Only exhibitors are allowed in show ring.
5. When entering feeder or market lambs indicate the section and class number 703 or 715.
6. First market class starts at 100 lbs.
7. Members may show two individual market or two individual feeder lambs.
8. A pen consists of two lambs, a limit of one pen.
9. An exhibitor may show one carcass lamb.
10. No market or feeder lambs can be shown in breed classes.
11. All exhibit wool can be tied with paper twine or in a paper or plastic bag, and be **2016 wool**. Wool must be placed in the display area in the exhibit building by noon on Monday.
12. Showmanship age as of Jan 1st of the current year.
13. Breeding Sheep must be owned by the exhibitor by the last Saturday in April. Market and carcass lambs must be weighed-in and tagged on the last Sunday in April or they will not be eligible for show.
14. Market lambs should be shorn before the fair.
15. Halters are optional for 12 and under in showmanship and market classes. Halters may be used by anyone in breeding classes.
16. A practice showmanship class will be held on Sunday at 5 p.m. for any exhibitor who wishes to participate. .
17. Lamb weigh-in will be on Sunday **July 9th** from 1-4 p.m. Lambs may only be weighed once.
18. No unethical fitting will be allowed.
19. An official scrapie ID must be presented at the same time.
20. There will be a manure disposal fee of \$3.00 per pen. Fees are due on May 1st. Please make checks payable to the Eaton County Agriculture Society.
21. All market animals must be owned by the exhibitor.

THESE RULES HAVE BEEN APPROVED BY THE MICHIGAN STATE SHEEP COMMITTEE

1. No muzzles on lambs at any time.
2. Pens to be bedded with natural material (wood shavings, straw, etc.) no carpets.
3. While in the show ring the lamb is to be shown with all four feet on the ground.
4. Water must be available in pens at all times except 12 hours prior to entering show ring.
5. Humane handling practices of sheep at all time.
6. No liquid feeding of lambs.
7. The tail can be lifted from the exterior

Ribbons

1. Animal must respond by use of halter only.
2. Present sheep in an attractive manner.
3. Exhibitor will be judged on the mode of dress selected, which must be appropriate, attractive, with at least one article of clothing made of wool or wool blend; in addition to how sheep respond to halter.
4. Classes are open to both boys and girls.
5. Animal need not be owned by exhibitor.
6. A different animal must be used by Jr. and Sr. exhibitors.
7. Ages for all classes as of Jan 1st of the current year.
